ABOUT DFL

Founded in 2010, the Daughters for Life Foundation (DFL) is a registered Canadian charity dedicated to providing access to high-quality education to girls and women facing socio-economic adversity and hardship in the Middle East. In 2020, DFL celebrated a decade of investing in and empowering women in the Middle East with the help of our partners across the world. Despite the hardships brought on by COVID-19, we worked tirelessly to continue supporting the dreams of women across the Middle East in pursuing higher education and brighter futures. DFL provides scholarships, financial awards and fellowships to women in the Middle East regardless of their ethnicity, nationality, or religious affiliation.

While DFL's scholarship program helps women pursue post-secondary education globally, the financial awards we deliver support students attending universities in the Middle East. Our fellowship program provides women from universities in the Middle East with the opportunity to participate in academic activities conducted by educational institutions around the world. Our recipients are chosen based on their academic achievements, socio-economic hardships, and their commitment to improving the lives of women in the Middle East.

Since its inception, DFL has helped over 400 girls realize their potential and pursue their dreams. By the end of 2020, we have awarded 59 scholarships for women to study at international universities. In addition, over 341 financial awards and 5 fellowships have been granted to support meritorious students to continue their education in the Middle East. Our goal is to invest in the potential of women from the Middle East to take on leadership roles in the future. We want to support their dreams of becoming skilled professionals in any field they choose to pursue.





NATIONAL MENTORSHIP DAY

Hosted by DFL fellow, Hiba Zaaroura, the Mentorship Webinar was a great success and a wonderful way to celebrate National Mentorship Day. Hiba is currently completing a clinical fellowship in Advanced Medical Dermatology at Sunnybrook Healthcare Centre in Toronto, and is DFL's first medical fellow in Canada.

DFL launched a mentorship program in November 2020 to help DFL applicants with university applications. The application process can be overwhelming for many students who may be unfamiliar with how to apply to international universities. The mentorship program connected DFL applicants with current DFL scholars and volunteers who helped guide them through the process, providing insight on their applications, including resume and essay submissions, interview tips and educational material. Many participants of the mentorship program were not eligible for a DFL scholarship, but were still able to receive mentorship and guidance.

Art Auction

To continue to support scholars through their undergraduate, graduate, and post-graduate studies, DFL looked to the community for support from our community! DFL organized an auction of 3 artworks created and donated by the talented Canadian artist Mike Hammer. Virtual Campaigns


