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About The Daughters for Life Foundation

Founded in 2010, the Daughters for Life Foundation (DFL) is a registered Canadian charity dedicated to providing access to high-quality education to girls and women facing socio-economic adversity and hardship in the Middle East. DFL, along with the help of our partners across the world, have been investing in and empowering women for over a decade. We work tirelessly to continue supporting the dreams of women across the Middle East in pursuing higher education and brighter futures. DFL provides scholarships, financial awards and fellowships to women in the Middle East regardless of their ethnicity, nationality, or religious affiliation.

While DFL's scholarship program helps women pursue post-secondary education globally, the financial awards we deliver support students attending universities in the Middle East. Our fellowship program provides women from universities in the Middle East with the opportunity to participate in academic activities conducted by educational institutions around the world. Our recipients are chosen based on their academic achievements and their commitment to improving the lives of women in the Middle East.

Since its inception, DFL has helped 408 girls realize their potential and pursue their dreams. Since the end of 2021, we have awarded 61 scholarships for women to study at international universities. In addition, over 341 financial awards and 6 fellowships have been granted to support meritorious students to continue their education in the Middle East. Our goal is to invest in the potential of women from the Middle East to take on leadership roles in the future. We want to support their dreams of becoming skilled professionals in any field they choose to pursue.

We demonstrate leadership in advocating for the empowerment of women through rigorous admission practices, good governance, innovative funding and professional growth opportunities. 2021 Scholarship and Fellowship Winners



2021 was a year of new partnerships and experiences for DFL and its scholars. For the first time in its history, DFL established a partnership with the Hebrew University of Jerusalem. Two brilliant scholars were able to secure spots for graduate-level study in 2021 at the university after the scholarship selection cycle.

Farah Qadi



Farah Qadi was one of DFL's two scholars who joined the foundation in 2021. She began her studies at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem pursuing a masters degree in Nonprofit Leadership and Management in the non-profit sector. She has an undergraduate degree in English Literature with a double-minor in Translation and Business Administration at Birzeit University in Palestine, speaking to the broad scope of her interests and skills. She overcame immense adversity throughout her academic career including grappling with mental illness and a lack of support from those in her inner circle who doubted her immense potential.

Thankfully, Farah did not let any of these hardships stop her, going forward to becoming a high-achieving student acknowledged on Birzeit University's Honors List and becoming one of DFL's first-ever scholars enrolled at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem.

Her strong-held value of holding an open mind and maintaining respect for all faiths, nationalities and those from all walks of life paired with her academic and professional experience is certain to set her up for success to achieve her dreams.

These unique experiences are made possible through DFL's partnerships with medical centres, hospitals and similar institutions that provide mentorship, guidance and irreplaceable experience to fellows who work alongside medical professionals busy at work in the field.

In 2021, DFL happily welcomed its newest fellow: the brilliant Dr. Saja Anabusi, who began her fellowship on the 1st of July 2021 at both Mount Sinai Hospital's maternal-fetal unit and the University of Toronto's Temerty Faculty of Medicine. Hailing from a small Arab town in Palestine, Dr. Anabusi successfully completed her BSc in Medical Sciences, attaining a degree in medicine as a certified doctor at Technion University in Israel. As a community leader, she also continuously makes it her goal to give back and support her local community. Prior to attaining her fellowship, she also held a residency position, led and executed multiple projects relating to maternal-fetal medicine and strives to serve her patients with the highest level of care and compassion possible. She was the ideal candidate, embodying the spirit of the fellowship program which has the goal of equipping women with the ability to learn and adapt from working in realistic medical environments. Due to an acute lack of OB-GYN physicians in Palestine, Dr. Anabusi intends to make a great impact by serving her community and by being a pillar of support for high-risk pregnancy patients.

Achievements

Despite the difficulties the world is facing because of the Covid-19 pandemic, Dr. Abuelaish's achievements have been exceptional, exceeding any expectations and more. He's been productive in so many ways. Academically through teaching, in research publications as well as professionally and creatively in speaking and media engagements around the globe.

Teaching the course Directed Field Experience: Health, Peace and Women's Health in Palestine and Israel amongst many more courses. Dr. Abulealish established the Global Institute for the study of Socio-endemic Diseases, Hatred, Health, and Peace. A Chair was created under his name for the Institute which is located at Antwerp University and in Partnership with two Belgian Universities including ULB and VUB.

Amongst other academic achievements, student supervision, nominations and appointments, Dr. Abuelaish has published five pieces including How to become a good ancestor. He finished filming a documentary based on his book. It's a Canadian/French Production supported by CBC. It starts screening this spring, keep an eye out!

In March of 2021, DFL's President and Founder, Dr. Abuelaish was awarded an honorary degree from the University of Antwerp for general merit in recognition of his contributions to the empowerment of girls and young women through education. Thanks to DFL, these scholars are able to become agents of change for the enhancement of life throughout the Middle East.

On April 14, 2021, Dr. Abuelaish, was a guest speaker at the virtual 16th Annual Senior College Symposium "Roots of Violence" where he presented a talk on "Deconstructing Hatred as a Contagious Disease, A Public Emergency Threat, and a Detriment of Health". With data-driven information, Dr. Abuelaish gave insight on ways to move away from the negative impacts of hatred. Education is one of the ways to make a positive change in society which is why the support of DFL is so worthwhile.

In October, Dr. Abuelaish was the recipient of the Robert Geisendörfer Prize for radio and television productions.

Through 2021, he gave 15 keynote speeches at different international Institutions in Canada, Germany, Belgium, the USA, Israel, and Palestine. In November, Dr. Abuelaish was a keynote speaker on Women's Education at a Conference in City Hall, Brussels. Always advocating, always pushing forward women's right to education. This is what DFL is about.

New Chapter in Europe



In the effort to broaden the reach of DFL's mission of expanding educational access and the equality and empowerment of women, the foundation took a huge step in bringing its life-changing programs to an even wider set of deserving women last year.

On November 26th, 2021, the Daughters for Life Foundation: Europe (DFLE) was officially established after months of planning. Under the guidance and support of the DFL Canada team and its board of directors, the European branch was established to serve as the first foreign chapter of the foundation and is based in Brussels. The official announcement of the European chapter outlined a huge goal achieved by DFL as branching out was a long-term hope for the foundation.

DFLE scholars, much like their North American and Middle East-based counterparts, will have the opportunity to attend highly distinguished institutions throughout Europe. Already off to a strong start following the announcement last fall, it was also announced that the first partnership was already forged with the University of Antwerp in Belgium. The first DFLE scholar will be enrolled starting from the Fall 2022 term.



This would not have been possible without the incredible board of directors overseeing the activities of the DFLE chapter. They are a collective of professionals who have a broad pool of talents stretching across many fields that include but are not exclusive to: women's rights advocacy, education, medicine, law, governance and public affairs, humanitarian issues, digitalization among many more. They make up the team who will work to facilitate new partnerships, pathways and connections throughout Europe to provide more opportunities for students. As the board has been settling in, they've been supported every step of the way by the staff based at the Toronto headquarters, ensuring a smooth start to what is an exciting time for the foundation.

This expansion is credited to Dr. Abuelaish's initial hope to honour his daughters and his niece who were lost in a tragic attack in 2009. In the face of hate, he chose to rise above and choose peace, and honour their memory by carrying their passion for education forward, ensuring that many young women would have the opportunity to study freely.

Mentorship Program



In the summer of 2021, DFL's Scholars proposed the revival and restructuring of the mentorship program initiative ahead of the 2022 scholarship program cycle. This stemmed from the scholars' own generosity and desire to support incoming scholarship applicants and prospective scholars in navigating the application process and was proposed initially by DFL scholar Esraa Naguib.

Primarily, it focused on giving one-on-one support, connecting a scholar with a single applicant whom they would mentor. Whether on the application process itself, providing insight on programs of study, professional development or otherwise, the scholars were eager to lend a helping hand and to share their wealth of knowledge with those hoping to receive the same once-in-a-lifetime opportunity they were able to get. Both the DFL team and its volunteers provided support on this project throughout.

Secondary aspects of the program were related to delegation of organizational and logistics roles between volunteers, and Scholars, and creating a resource database via Google Drive for all DFL applicants to access containing resources for their reference.

Alumni Group

The Daughters For Life Alumni group is an initiative focused on uplifting, supporting and creating an encouraging network of DFL's graduating alumni. The idea was in the works for several years but the first steps of formal development were taken at the start of 2021, spearheaded by one of DFL's board members, Lorna J. Edmonds, along with board member Darina Landa and Jacklin Ibrahim, the director of programs and operations at the foundation. Together they fleshed out the long and short-term goals of the project. Waed Hassan is the leading DFL alumna of this initiative.



Firstly, the group serves as a hub of support for the alumni who share a bond of being DFL graduates, providing each other with a strong support system both professionally and interpersonally. Alumni always have a pool of contacts who understand their unique experience as a fellow scholars, who can provide social and mental support throughout their many endeavours, and who can be professional networking contacts as well. Secondly, the project allows for the creation of a channel of communication between DFL and the graduates of the scholarship program, providing the foundation with updates on their progress after their studies, providing support to alumni where possible and generally remaining in contact.

To facilitate these goals, it was hoped that the group could hold regular meetings on a monthly basis to bring everyone up-to-date on each other's growth and progress and that the group could branch out to hold exciting events such as webinars, talks and discussions, featuring special guest speakers to enrich the experience for the alumni group members.

2021 Fundraising Campaign



On a global scale, the COVID-19 pandemic has affected every aspect of daily life. It has especially exacerbated the challenges that many women face while completing their education, adding to the many obstacles on their paths. Although we came across challenges such as the suspension of our annual event and difficulties with funding, we did not lose sight of our mission to support women and uplift them, especially in the hardest of times.

With this in mind, during the summer of 2021, we launched a successful digital fundraising campaign called “**Shining Scholars: Educate a Woman, Ignite her Spark.**” The focus was twofold: to highlight our DFL scholars' excellence while bolstering further support for women's education and had the fundraising goal of \$50,000. The campaign was to take the place of our beloved annual Gala event where guests, supporters, our shining scholars and many other partners gather to celebrate and underline the mission of DFL.

Although we could not gather due to the ongoing pandemic, we were amazed by the overwhelming support our fundraising campaign received. Thanks to the generosity of our many donors, the Shining Scholars campaign was able to raise \$25,400 which has gone towards the funding of undergraduate and graduate-level education of women from all over the Middle East.

2021 Canada Summer

Jobs Interns

The Canada Summer Jobs (CSJ) program is an initiative established by the federal government with the goal of providing young Canadians with paid work experiences in their transition into the professional workforce during their studies by providing wage subsidies to a variety of organizations with less than 50 permanent employees seeking to hire for the summer season.

The Daughters for Life Foundation would like to extend its sincere gratitude to the MP Ya'ara Saks for her continued support and for her initial recommendation to the federal government on DFL's behalf. Through this effort, DFL was able to receive CSJ grants, allowing the foundation to hire three interns for the very first time in 2021. Nelia served as a marketing intern, Venuya was our fundraising intern and Hodan was our scholarship intern.

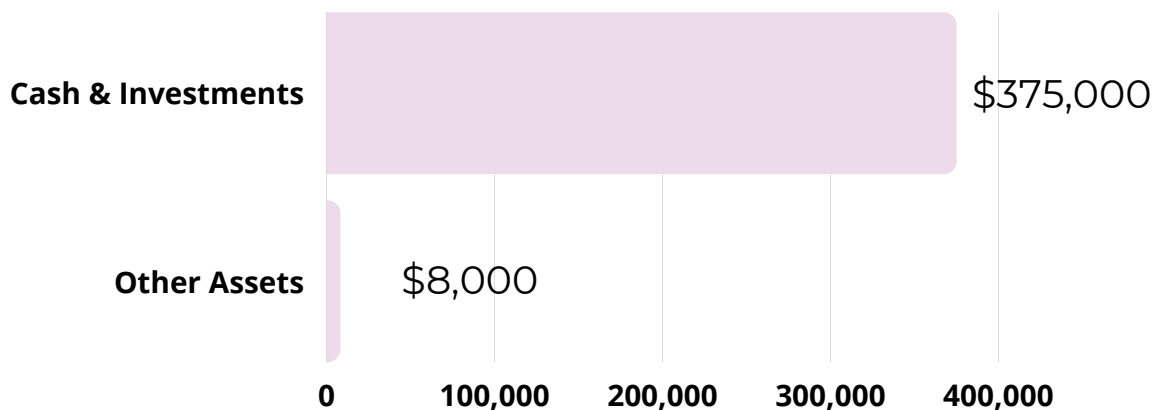

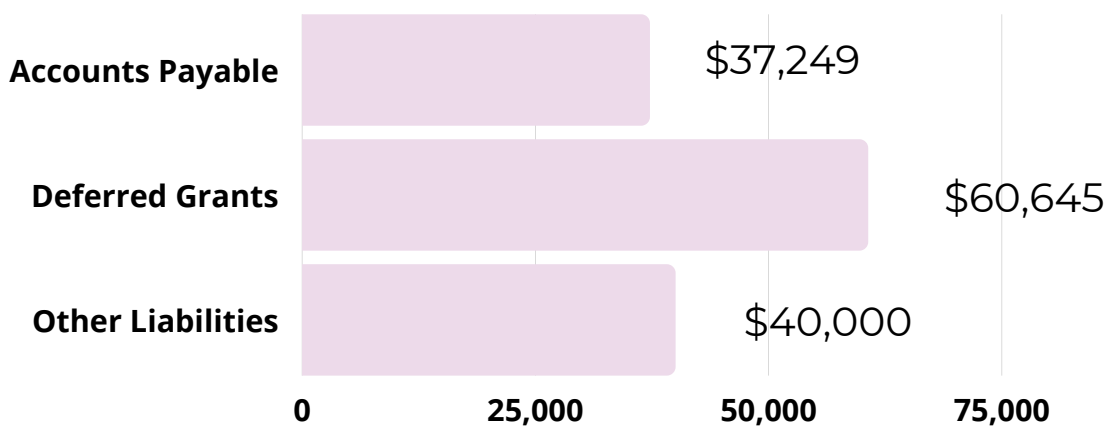

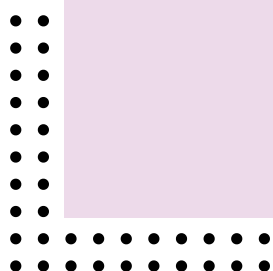
